"What Kind of King Is He?"

We gather together this weekend to celebrate the Eucharist on the Feast of Christ the King. Jesus is our King. We are his servants.

But what kind of King is he? The answer to that question will determine what kind of servants we are called to be.

As we read the Scriptures, we see that Jesus' Kingship is not of the kind we see, or have seen, in our world. His is a contradiction to power, status, position, and privilege. Do we dare be called his servants?

The playwright, Eugene Ionesco, once said,

The human comedy doesn't attract me enough.

I am not entirely of this world...I am from elsewhere.

And it is worth finding this elsewhere beyond the walls.

But where is it?

How do we go beyond the walls that this world builds? Is the "elsewhere" worth searching for? Jesus says, "Yes, it is." He helps us in the search, and makes the search worthwhile. He gives meaning to all of life, meaning that the world is not able to give.

Philip Yancey, in his book, *The Jesus I Never Knew*, describes how Jesus leads us to the Kingdom in the midst of this world:

I feel convicted by this quality of Jesus every time I get involved in a cause I strongly believe in. How easy it is to join the politics of polarization, to find myself shouting across the picket lines at the 'enemy' on the other side. How hard it is to remember that the kingdom of God calls me to love the woman who has just emerged from the abortion clinic (and, yes, even her doctor), the promiscuous person who is dying of AIDS, the wealthy landowner who is exploiting God's creation. If I cannot show love to such people, then I must question whether I have truly understood Jesus' gospel.

A political movement by nature draws lines, makes distinctions, pronounces judgment; in contrast, Jesus' love cuts across lines, transcends distinctions, and

dispenses grace. Regardless of the merits of a given issue—whether a pro-life lobby out of the Right or a peace and justice lobby out of the Left—political movements risk pulling onto themselves the mantle of power that smothers love. From Jesus I learn that, whatever activism I get involved in, it must not drive out love and humility, or otherwise I betray the kingdom of heaven.

As we honor our King, let us not betray him. Let us be a people of love and humility in all situations, not a people of power, a people of domination. Let us never draw lines, make distinctions, or pronounce judgments.

As his servants, we allow him to lead us to the elsewhere, beyond the walls of this world!

THE GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MARK

a new author for a new liturgical year

probably living outside of the Holy Land in a place that was largely populated by non-Jews. We know this because Mark, in some places, appears to be confused about the geography of Palestine (see 5:1 and 7:31) and indicates that his audience would not be familiar with Jewish customs (7:4). He also at times translates Aramaic terms into Greek for his Greek speaking audience (5:41: 15:34).

century after Christ. The earliest

The date of the Gospel according to Mark depends largely on how one understands Jesus's prediction of the fall of the Jerusalem Temple to the

Romans in 70 AD. Those who believe this prediction was created by Mark and not actually spoken by Jesus understand this verse to refer to the actual destruction of the Temple in 70 AD. Thus the Gospel must have been after that date yet early enough to have become a primary source for the other two synoptic Gospel accounts, Matthew and Luke, written some time in the decades following Mark. Scholars who argue that it is not unlikely that Jesus himself would have made such a prediction about the fall of the Temple often date the Gospel according to Mark to around 60-70 AD and even more precisely to the probable time of Peter's death in Rome under the Emperor Nero (c. 64 AD).

It is best to understand Mark not as giving us information about the life of Jesus or as a source of Peter's teaching but rather as a Gospel created by an independent and fascinating theologian who crafted the story of Jesus to communicate deep theological insight about Christian life in Christ. How Mark does this is to take us deep into an

understanding of the two primary sacraments of the earliest Christian Churches: the immersion in water known as Baptism and the sacred meal known as the Lord's Supper.

Mark has created a brilliant theological narrative whose message is as relevant today as it was then: our Baptism unites all of us to Christ and joins us together at the Eucharistic meal to experience a new life and new creation united with Christ.
